Widening the Circle Campaign Launches April 7



UUFN members voted on March 10 to have a capital campaign to raise funds for a building addition to meet the needs of our growing congregation. The campaign will be a joint campaign for the annual budget and for special capital gifts payable over three years for the building addition. Thirteen members of our congregation have stepped forward to serve as Visiting Stewards. The campaign will kick off in a special celebration after the service on April 7 and then the visiting stewards will begin to contact members of the congregation to set time for conversations and ask for pledges of support. The UUFN Board has endorsed this final version of the Land Acknowledgment Statement. There will be a chance for the congregation to endorse it at the annual meeting.

We the members of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Northfield (UUFN) acknowledge the genocide, stolen land and forced removal of the Wahpekute and other bands of the Dakota people who for centuries were stewards of the land on which UUFN is located.

We commit to building the mindfulness necessary to disengage from participation in the ongoing and unjust legacy of colonialism.

We recognize contemporary Dakota people live in our midst and are actively involved in honoring and preserving their ancient wisdom, knowledge and culture.

With this acknowledgement, we as a community commit:

- to help heal this injustice by hearing stories of this place and those who have lived here for generations,
- to learn about Indigenous history and
- to advocate for just public policy that impacts Indigenous people.

We pledge to take action to support Indigenous peoples as we live together in Mni Sota Makoce (Minnesota).
