Music Sunday is a tradition at UUFN. This year, we will resume during the calendar year! Together, we'll dive further into what it means to listen deeply, how we listen to one another, and how we ultimately listen to our own inner voice. Most of us think of grief as what happens following the death of a loved one. Grief includes that kind of acutely painful loss, but it encompasses so much more. For this service, we will expand our traditional Service of Remembrance. We will honor the veil between life and death as so many cultures do this time of year, and we will also allow space for other types of grief such as complicated, cumulative, delayed, and disenfranchised grief.

You are invited to bring a memento of someone or something you are grieving as we create an altar together honoring our grief and the enduring power of love. This memento might be of a loved one who has died, but it does not have to be. We will honor all types of grief, including those we don't always get to express.

Sacred Circles Registration Now Open!

<u>Sacred Circles</u> are small groups of around eight members that meet monthly to reflect on the month's theme. In between sessions, participants are invited to use the prompts in the provided <u>Soul Matter's packets</u> to notice how the month's theme is showing up in their lives. These groups invite you to experience each month's theme more deeply, and then connect with others who are doing the same.

Rev. Sara will lead an informal information session on Zoom about Sacred Circles groups on Monday, October 7th at 5pm. Anyone interested in simply finding out more about Sacred Circles is welcome to attend. (Note: this informal information session is different from the full orientation sessions for registered participants.)

This year we have four Sacred Circles groups: a group for people who are actively parenting, a young adult (ages 18-30ish) group, a Tuesday evening group, and a Friday late afternoon group. If you are interested in starting another identity-based group or one open to all, please contact Rev. Sara!

Groups will meet at UUFN. Some groups may choose to have some of their meetings on Zoom depending on winter weather and participant preferences.

Programming for Children and Families an update from Rev. Sara

This fall we are focusing on building relationships as the core of our programming for children and families. Some things will stay the same as previous years, but there are also some important changes:

- We will continue to have staffed nursery care for children up through preschool age almost every Sunday. (On October 6th our amazing nursery care worker, Julie, is out of town so we won't have nursery care that day.)
- We will have religious education classes for children up through 5th grade on the second and fourth Sundays of each month. We're talking about how to add programming for children and youth in grades six and up as well. We will likely add more Sundays when we offer RE programming, but the benefit of not having RE every Sunday is that it encourages us to make the sanctuary an ever more welcoming multigenerational space.
- On Sundays when RE isn't offered, the whole service will become more welcoming to all ages. This means things like:
 - Children will be invited to become Chalice Lighters to help lead the service.
 - We will have a table in the back of the sanctuary where children and their adult(s) can sit in order to color, do simple crafts, etc. Children and adults can move back and forth from there to their seats.
 - Once we finalize the tech setup, the RE room in the basement will have the service live streaming from Zoom, so parents can go and hang out there with their child(ren) if desired. This is a way both for kids to be able to move around more, and parents to connect with each other.

I realize that some parents will look forward to worshiping with their children more often, and some will be disappointed that some weeks they won't get one. single. hour. for their own spiritual growth without having to be a caregiver. I hope this schedule – RE classes twice a month, and multigenerational worship twice a month – meets the needs of both groups in some way.

In addition to those Sunday morning offerings, I will be facilitating a **Sacred Circle small group for parents**. This will be the 4th Saturday morning of the month from 10-11:30 am starting in October. <u>Register here</u>.

During that time while parents are meeting for our small group, our choir director, Taylor Wesseln, will be starting a **Children's Choir**. Fun!



Who Are We?

Makoce Ikikcupi, meaning Land Recovery, is a project of Reparative Justice on Dakota land in Minisota Makoce (Minnesota). The Makoce Ikikcupi project seeks to bring some of our relatives home, re-establish our spiritual and physical relationship with our homeland, and ensure the ongoing existence of our People. Our cultural survival depends on it.

Why Do We Matter?

Dakota people were systematically dispossessed of our homeland and we currently reside on about .01 % (about one-hundredth of one percent) of our original land base within the borders of what is now the State of Minnesota. Our work is a positive action to help repair the most fundamental harm of settler-colonialism–Indigenous disconnection from the land.
